





2015/16 Membership Application Process





















Criw Celf is an art project for gifted and more able children and young people. The project is delivered by all local authorities in north Wales and receives financial support by the Arts Council for Wales.

What is Criw Celf?

A series of masterclasses that gives an opportunity for those children who have shown talent and/or a special interest in art to develop their skills and experiences.

Who will lead the sessions?

Professional and experienced artists will be employed to lead the sessions.

What does membership include?

- Members will be able to attend a programme of one-day master classes in the
 company of professional artists who specialize in various art genres. A total of 6 days
 training will be on offer every year; they will be held on Saturdays or Sundays. As Criw
 Celf members come from across the counties and the fact that the programme of
 activities strives to give Criw Celf members varied and exciting experiences, some
 travelling will be required to different venues within the counties.
- One gallery / studio visit.
- Each young artist will receive an art pack containing various quality art materials. The
 purpose of providing these packs will be to enable the children to practice drawing
 at home.
- Exhibitions of the children's artwork.

Is there a charge?

The scheme is highly subsidised by the Local Authorities and the Arts Council for Wales and every child will be required to pay an annual membership fee of £35.00. Enquiries could be made to the school or the More Able and Talented officer at each local authority to see if there is a possibility of assistance with funding.

It will be the parents' responsibility to transport their children to the sessions and to provide packed lunches.

How to apply?

- Only 25 children per county can be accommodated in 2015-16
- Each school can nominate 10 pupils for consideration
- Individual applications from pupils outside of mainstream education are welcomed.

Every primary school in the participating counties will be invited to nominate up to ten pupils who have shown a special talent and/or interest in art to be a member of Criw Celf. For further details about how to apply, closing date and age of pupils, please refer to your county's section. Every child nominated will need to submit the following for assessment:

- A 2D self-portrait, created using any art material or combination of art materials. (No more than A3 sized paper)
- A drawing of the view from any window in their home, created using any art material
 or combination of art materials. (No more than A3 sized paper) or a 2D/3D artwork
 inspired by the theme of 'Dream' (if the work is big photographs accepted)
- A short paragraph explaining why they would like to join Criw Celf. (No more than 50 words).

Please ensure that all submissions include name, age, school, home address, parents' email address and home telephone number on the back of each piece of work. Only artwork which includes this information will be considered.









Who can apply and the deadline for submissions are individual to each county. Please check the details for your region carefully.

Please note that it is the child's natural ability we need to see when assessing the artwork. It is vitally important that the child does not receive any help by an adult or artist to create their submissions.
